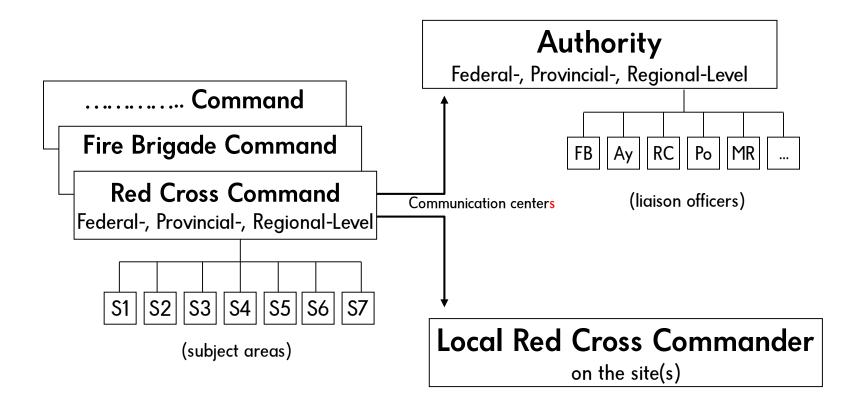
The Austrian Red Cross

- Largest humanitarian aid organisation in Austria
- Largest provider of rescue, ambulance service and of psychosocial support
- Main actor in Austria's Civil Society
 - EMS
 - First responder
 - "Team Austria" etc.
- Competence:
 - Voluntary Management
 - Disaster Management
 - Strategies
 - Lobbying

Information Management Tools – national (and international)

- Office Tools (E-Mail, Phone, Fax, MS Office, etc.)
- During operations: Radio Communication (TETRA, VHF, ...) and Satellite Communication (IRIDIUM, THURAYA, BGAN)
- Web-Based Systems (e.g. FÜIS, Ruatti Commander)
- Dispatch Software in our Emergency Call Centers







FÜIS (Command Information System)

- Financed and supported by the Styrian government
- Free access for all emergency organizations
- Training, planning and response, operation control and information
- Information sharing between different organizations in action (real time)
- Includes all necessary information of Styria for carrying out operation









(Emergency) Dispatcher Centers

- Basis:
 - Telephone and radiocommunication
 - Dispatch Software
- Gateway to other information systems active and passive
 - Internet, Webcams
 - Linked operation and control centers
 - Smartphone Applications (!)
 - Automatic GPS alerting systems

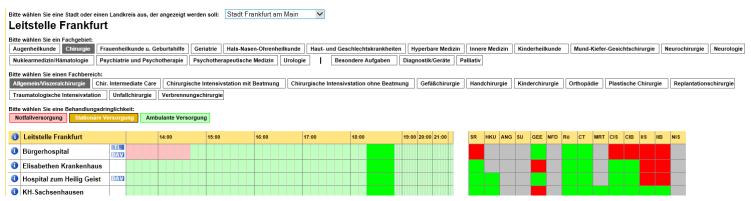




Dispatching First Responders in the same way as ambulance cars



IVENA (Interdisciplinary Patient-Centered Capacity Tool)



- Tool to optimize patient dispositions
- Open to the public
- Linked with all hospitals, their departments and resources
- Connected with ambulance services and dispatcher centers
- real-time access to disposable resources in hospitals



Information Management Tools - international

- Tools of IFRC Field Assessment and Coordination Team (FACT), Emergency Response Units (ERU), International Response Teams (IRT),
- Tools of EU Civil Protection Mechanism EU-Civil Protection Team (EUCPT), Technical Assistance Team (TAST), EU Modules,...
- Tools of UN United Nations Disaster Assessment and Coordination Team (UNDAC), UN Cluster Approach, etc.





RCRC - DMIS (Disaster Management Information System)

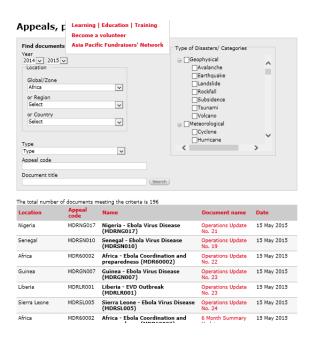
- DMIS is a web-based internal working tool
- Available only to Red Cross and Red Crescent staff working in national societies, delegations and the Geneva headquarter
 - Real time information on disaster trends
 - Information on internal and external resources
 - Offers tools and databases





RCRC - Appeals, Plans and Operation Updates

- Information tool open to the public and the red cross community
- Keep disasters in mind
- Fundraising





RCRC - Trilogy Emergency Relief Application

- In cooperation with telecommunication providers
- Allows aid agencies and mobile phone users in disaster areas to interact in real time
- It is an SMS two way communication system between disaster affected people and aid agencies
- One mobile phone can give Information to a whole community by oral dissemination

- GDACS Global Disaster Alert and Coordination System
- Virtual OSSOC On-Site Operations Coordination Centre
- ERCC Portal Emergency Response Coordination Centre

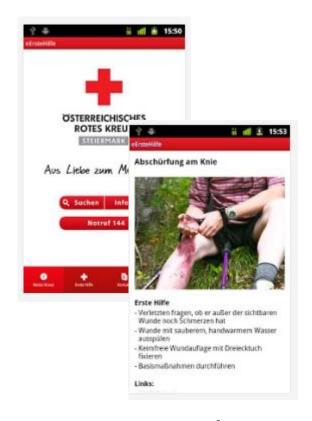
Holistic Approaches

SMS Alerting Systems

- For People living in endangered areas
- SMS on the mobile phone
- indicates a hazard in case of an impending storm, hail, heavy rain, floods etc.
- Give measures for the protection of people and their property





Communication for raising resilience

- There is a need of communication
 - Real time information
 - Preparedness information
 - Activate help for small tasks
 - Give and get situation information up-to-date
 - Give specific recovery information
 - ...

... to get a more resilient population and not only customers!

- Is a crowd tasking tool to strengthen resilience of the public and a utility for non-trained volunteers.
- It shall optimize and foster the operational power of volunteers recruited by the Team Austria.
