1. Regulatory context

➤ **EU Council Directive 2008/114/EC on the identification and designation of European Critical Infrastructures (ECI)**

- Scope in 2008: Energy and Transport Sectors
- Review in 2012: Possibly extension to ICT sector

➔ need to define sectoral criteria to identify ECI in the ICT sector (= ICT criteria)

➤ **COM(2009) 149 = Critical Information Infrastructure Protection (CIIP) Action Plan**

- 5th pillar = Develop proposal for ICT criteria = establishment of EP3R



2. Establishment of EP3R (1/3)

European Public Private Partnership for Resilience (EP3R)

- Supported by the Ministerial Conference on CIIP (Tallinn, 27-28/4/2009)
- Reiterated by the Council Resolution (18/12/2009)
- Consultation with stakeholders on creation of EP3R
- Organisation of two workshops (June and November 2009)
- Production of the non-paper synthesising the main results of the consultations



2. Establishment of EP3R (2/3)

➤ The governance challenge:

- Governments responsible for maintaining the stability and prosperity → responsible for defining Critical Information Infrastructures (CII) – related policies BUT key responsibility for their implementation rests with private sector
 - ➡ a need for more coordination and cooperation between these two parties
 - ➡ establishment of Public Private Partnerships (PPP) as a new governance model

➤ Objectives

- Provision of EU-wide governance framework involving governments and private sector; Provision of platform for information sharing; Discuss public policy priorities, objectives and measures; Identify and promote the adoption of good practices for security and resilience

➤ Scope

- Initial phase: ICT sector (sub-sectors of fixed and mobile telecommunications and internet)



2. Establishment of EP3R (3/3)

- **WG1:**
Key assets, resources and functions for the continuous and secure provisioning of electronic communications across countries
- **WG2:**
Baseline requirements for security and resilience of electronic communications
- **WG3:**
Coordination and cooperation needs and mechanisms to prepare for and respond to large scale disruptions affecting electronic communications
