# Purpose of the ISS

- Ambitious priorities: building on best practices, using available resources and expertise, emphasis on prevention
- Clear roles and responsibilities: specific actions, all-sectors – public, private and voluntary, Member States, EU institutions and agencies
- Commitment to implementation of a shared agenda



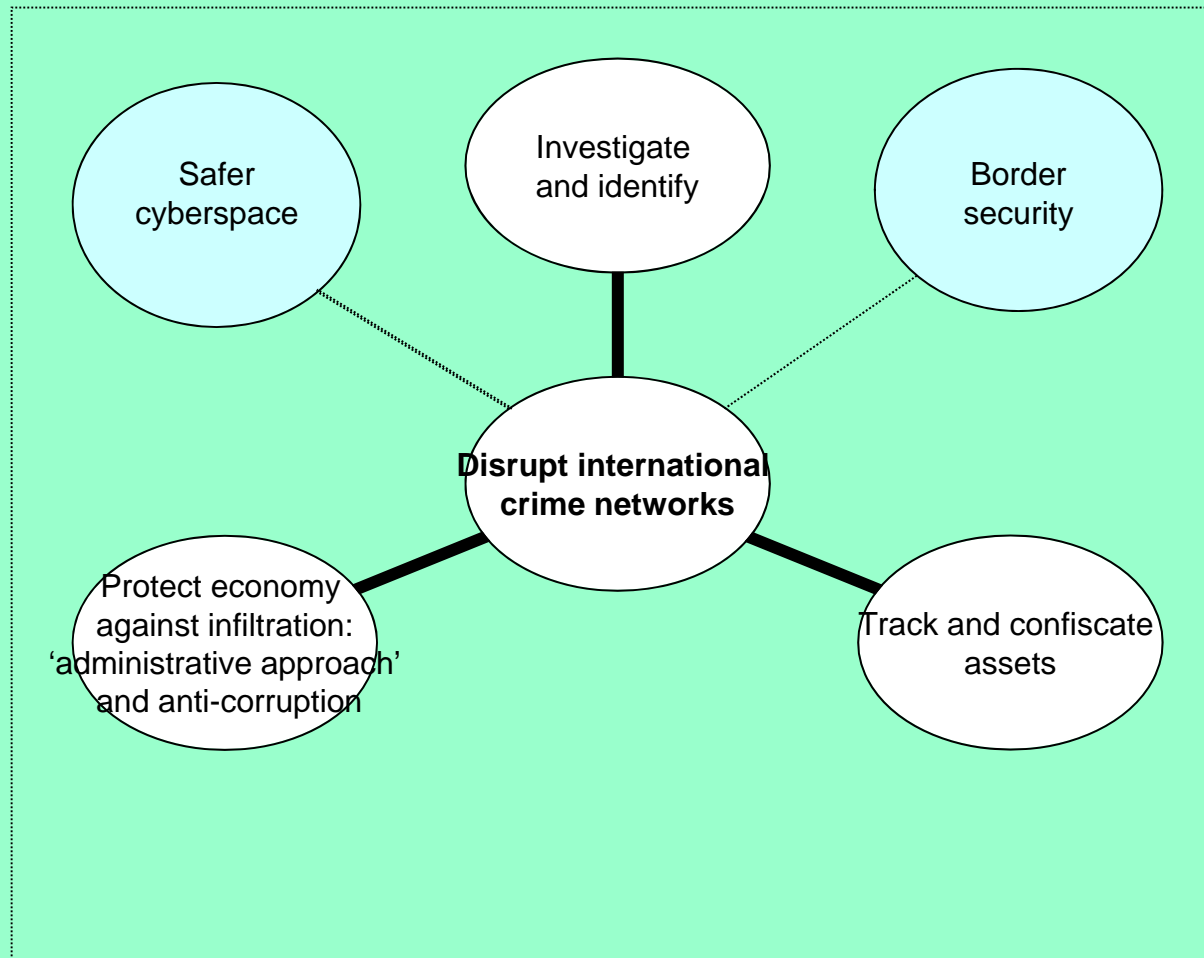

- Solidarity: implementation of Article 222

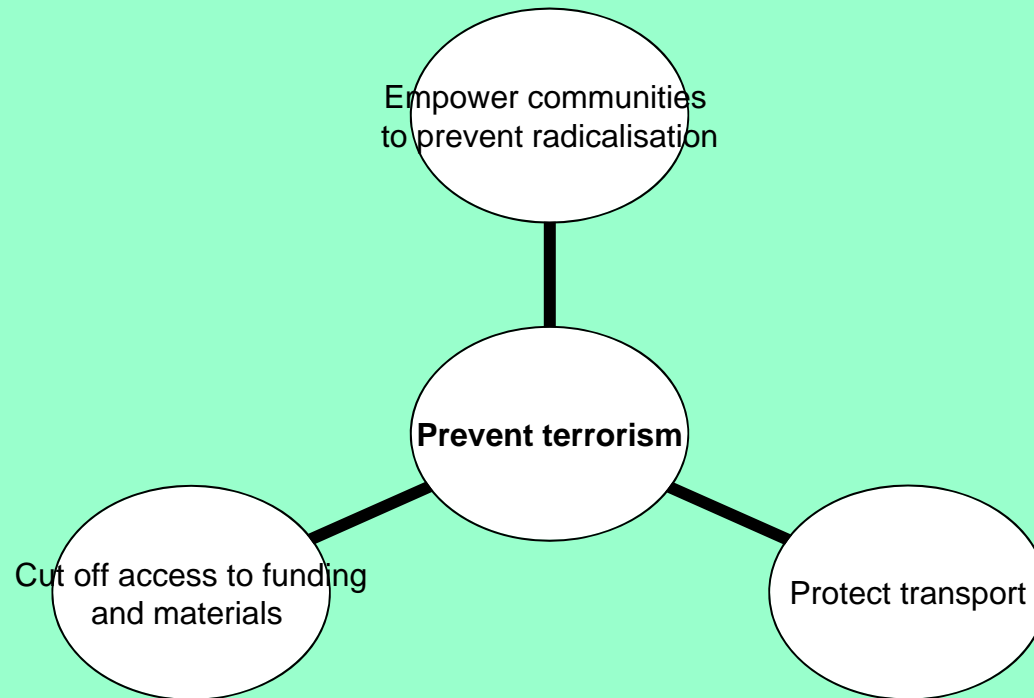
# Principles of the EU security model

- *Shared agenda* for tackling common threats
- *Policies rooted in our values* democracy, rule of law, human rights, solidarity
- *Global perspective* One security aim for internal and external action
- *Cross-sectoral* All relevant sectors involved in tackling cross-sectoral threats

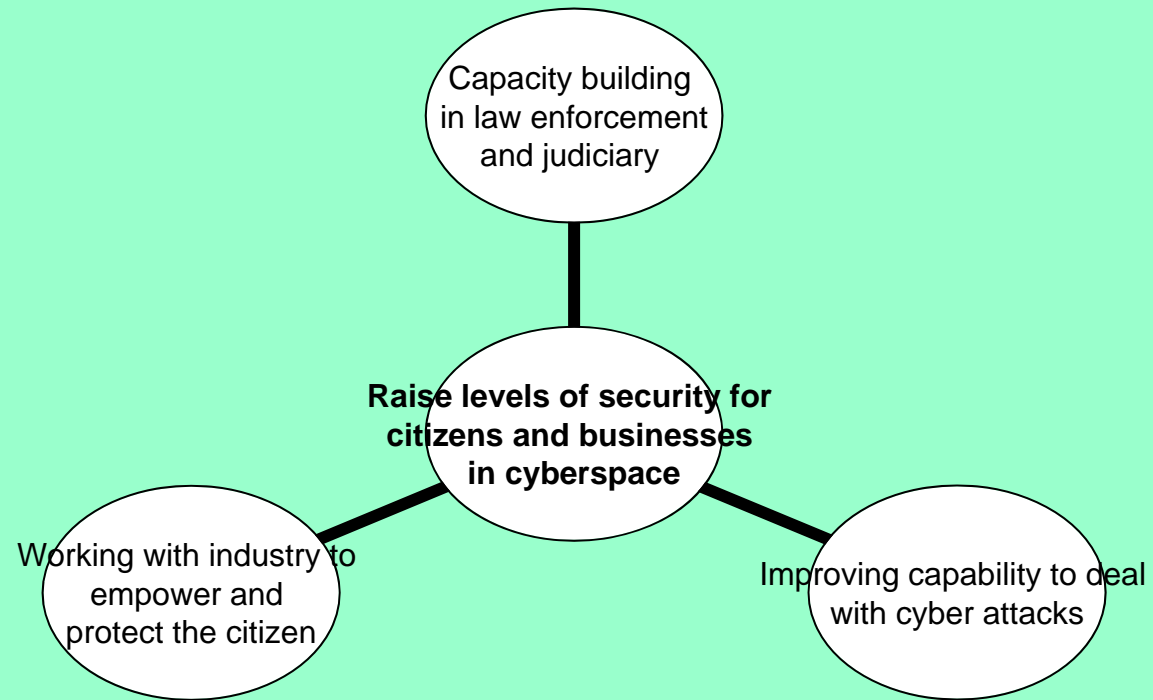
